One plant did so well, it got too big for my stand and I let him take it home to nurse it and divide it so he could have one, while I had my right knee replaced back in June. We had planned to rendez-vous so I could get one part back, as soon as he got back from fishing in late September or early October. Now, it seems that the Sunday (9/29/2019) Bromeliad Tea our club had at Peder & Marilyn's in Redwood City was to be the last time I'd see him. I am just heartsick for the loss of a good friend.
